Fig. 353 represents a moss having its antheridia and pistillidia on different plants. At a you notice a moss-plant with sessile leaves and branched stem, ending in a sort of rosette, which is seen in section at b, where you may observe the peculiar cylindrical bodies growing among the leaves. These are antheridia. One of these bodies, detached and much magnified, is seen at c. The stalk-like bodies accompanying the antheridia (h) are called paraphyses. They are not well understood, but are thought to be abortive states of the antheridia. At first these little organs contain mucilage, but, when mature, their contents, seen escaping at e, are granular, and each of the little ejected...
